We trace our roots back to 1899 when veterans of the Spanish-American War (1898) and the Philippine Insurrection (1899-1902) founded local organizations to secure rights and benefits for their service. Many arrived home wounded or sick. There was no medical care or veterans' pension for them, and they were left to care for themselves. In their misery, some of these veterans banded together and formed organizations that would eventually band together and become known as the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

Our Mission: To foster camaraderie among United States veterans of overseas conflicts. To serve our veterans, the military and our communities. To advocate on behalf of all veterans.

Comrades,

I want to first thank every VFW member who joined me in Washington, DC or tuned in online for the VFW's testimony before the House and Senate Veterans Affairs Committees on March 4. You truly embraced the notion that this was more than a date, but a command. A command to stand up for what we believe and hold our nation's leaders accountable.

During the hearing, the VFW was pressed on our concerns about recent cuts across VA, and I believe we delivered a strong message that's still resonating. I want to thank you for your vigilance and your passion in this matter. However, please do not get distracted by the noise and make sure you are keeping your eyes on the greater objective, which is ensuring our leaders "Honor the Contract" to provide timely care and benefits to our veterans at a time when our nation is losing perspective on the sacrifices of our men and women in uniform.

After the hearing, I know that VFW leaders at all levels fielded inquiries from the press about our feelings on recent cuts to VA and speculation about more cuts in the future. I want the VFW to be clear-eyed on this: If you see something concerning, please let me know. If you notice a degradation in services at your VA facility, let me know. But please know this – the VFW does not operate on speculation – we operate on facts. Don't get sucked into speculation, as this only dilutes the larger message to our nation's leaders.

Lately there has been a lot of speculation that VA will be cutting more jobs and returning to 2019 staffing levels. This is in response to directives from the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and the Office of Personnel Management (OPM), directing agencies to evaluate their business lines and recommend appropriate cuts to achieve President Trump's goal of making government more efficient. In this directive, there are explicit instructions for agencies to ensure that any proposed cuts will not degrade "direct services to citizens." Please read the memo for yourself directly from OPM [here](#).

Anyone who has ever navigated a government program knows that weeding out waste and modernizing business processes are bold tasks, but tasks that are in many ways overdue. When I met with VA Secretary Doug Collins, he acknowledged that it was bold, but noted that his vision is to make bold decisions that will better serve veterans, and that VA leaders across the organization were evaluating VA top to bottom, seeking to meticulously identify waste and modernize the system.

Many of you have heard me say that the most toxic words in the VFW are "but we have always done it that way." The same must be said for VA – and the VFW has been saying it for quite some time. If we were truly happy with the status quo, we wouldn't appear before Congress dozens of times a year, demanding changes like a 21st century GI Bill, transition assistance reform, appeals modernization, the PACT Act, real mental health reform, compensation exam reform, or consistent access to care from VA and community providers.



I understand that based on how the first round of cuts was presented publicly, some of you are skeptical. I shared my skepticism directly with Secretary Collins as well. Now comes the hard part. The VFW's concerns were heard, and VA is doing exactly what we asked them to do: Seeking to identify and excise waste with a scalpel, cutting out the bad without harming the good.

We know that VA has a timeline to evaluate its workforce by June. In that time, our task is not to operate on "what-ifs," but to offer our informed perspective directly to VA on where we see efficiencies and potential pitfalls, ensuring that VA can deliver the timely care and benefits that veterans have earned.

Again, thank you for your vigilance and your passion at this critical point for our nation's veterans. As we have done for the last 125 years, the VFW is up to this challenge because when VA succeeds, veterans succeed.



Automatic Payment Plan Terms and Conditions: You authorize the VFW to initiate electronic debit entries or affect a charge by any other commercially accepted practice to your account set forth above for the payment of dues reflected on this application. You understand such charges may be made within 2-3 business days of payment due date. For installment payments, charges will be made on or around the 1st or the 15th day of the month. This authorization will remain in full force until VFW has received notification from you of its termination or upon completion of the installment payments. Annual dues are subject to change. By completing this authorization, you acknowledge that you will only receive notice when the payment would differ by more than \$10.00 from the most recent payment. Contact VFW Member Services at 1-833-VFW-VETS (1-833-839-8387) or write VFW Member Services, 406 W. 34th St., Suite 316, Kansas City, MO 64111 to inquire about or cancel a payment, or to report problems such as bank closures, lost or stolen account numbers, closed accounts, or unauthorized transactions. Cancellation requests must be received no later than 11:59 p.m. Central Time ten business days prior to the scheduled payment date. If you are unaware of the charge date for your account, please contact VFW. If a payment is returned by your financial institution (e.g., due to insufficient funds, incorrect account information, closed account, etc.) the VFW will contact you at the address we have on file, explain why the payment could not be processed, and provide alternate payment options. The privilege of making payments under this agreement may be revoked by VFW if any item is not paid upon presentation. You may have additional rights and responsibilities under the Electronic Funds Transfer Act.

Life Membership Installment Plan Terms and Conditions: The VFW life membership installment plan allows any VFW member/applicant to purchase a life membership by making an initial payment of \$45.00 and (11) monthly payments. The member will be issued an annual membership card at the time of enrollment. A permanent life membership card will be issued upon the completion of payments. The life membership fee is determined from the schedule using the applicant's age on December 31 of the year in which the application is submitted. Delinquencies of 31-120 days can be corrected through make-up payment(s) or plan end date pushed forward. Member will be dropped from the installment plan after 120 days delinquent and all monthly payments made to date will be applied to future years annual dues.

VFW POST MEMBER TRANSFER DECLARATION (used for transfers in accordance with Sec. 107 of the Manual of Procedure): I hereby certify by signature on this application that it is my desire to transfer my membership as indicated above. DON'T FEED THE SHARKS

What we think a "Claim Shark" is:

- A Claim Shark is an individual or company that charges hefty fees to "assist" or "consult" veterans with filing their VA benefit claims – this practice is illegal!
- Claim Sharks are not VA accredited, meaning they aren't required to adhere to the well-established professional and ethical standards of VA accreditation, so their advice can often be misleading or even fraudulent.
- Like a "Loan Shark," once you're in, you can't get out, and may be subject to new and hidden fees whenever you get a new rating, no matter who does the work.

Some of their predatory practices are:

- Promising or guaranteeing an increased disability rating or percentage increase.
- Advertising expedited VA claims decisions.
- Requesting login credentials to access a veteran's personal information through secure VA websites like eBenefits or VA.gov.
- Using confusing tactics or ambiguous language to mislead claimants or coerce them into signing a contract.
- Telling veterans to forego VA exams and offering health consultations within their own network of doctors.

- Not providing access to Protected Health Information or Personal Identifiable Information.


