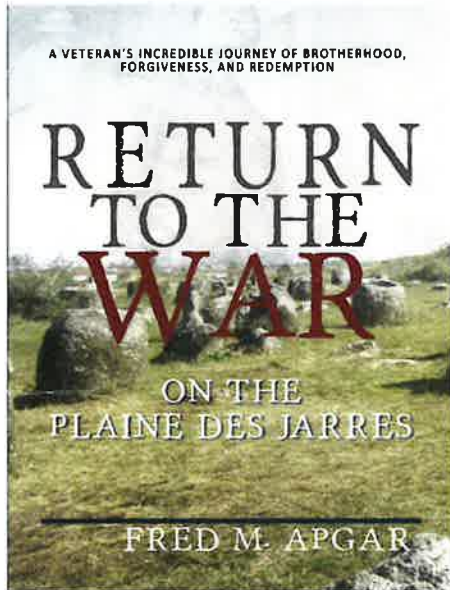

“I walked up and down the length of the old runway, trying to imagine life at Moung Soui during the war; calm and peaceful days interspersed with the frenetic pace of combat. I climbed a small hill that lined the west side of the old runway and looked out over what had once been a bustling military outpost but had now been forgotten by time. This was one of the compelling reasons I had traveled to Laos, to walk on hallowed ground. In silence, I walked among the ghosts of Moung Soui, anonymous and courageous warriors all. I kneeled on the runway in prayer, left tears on the red soil, and scooped up a handful of dirt from LS-108.”

Return to the War on the Plaines des Jarres, tells the incredible story of Fred Apgar’s journey from the battlefields of Laos during the Vietnam War to his return to those same battlefields 40 years later. Readers are introduced to the CIA’s “secret army,” *L’Armee Clandestine*, a “civilian” airline called Air America, Ravens, Lima Sites, Forward Air Guides, Road Watch Teams, Rules of Engagement, Search and Rescue Operations, and the infamous Ho Chi Minh Trail.

Return to the War on the Plaines des Jarres is an emotional story of self-discovery. During his journey, he met former enemy combatants, Hmong who fought for the USA, and civilians who were victims of the war. He traveled along the very same trails, roads, and rivers used by the Hmong, North Vietnamese, and Pathet Lao as they maneuvered to engage each other in battle. His greatest gift was given to him by total strangers, the blessings of Brotherhood, Forgiveness, and Redemption.

What we think a "Claim Shark" is:

- A Claim Shark is an individual or company that charges hefty fees to "assist" or "consult" veterans with filing their VA benefit claims – this practice is illegal!
- Claim Sharks are not VA accredited, meaning they aren't required to adhere to the well-established professional and ethical standards of VA accreditation, so their advice can often be misleading or even fraudulent.
- Like a "Loan Shark," once you're in, you can't get out, and may be subject to new and hidden fees whenever you get a new rating, no matter who does the work.

Some of their predatory practices are:

- Promising or guaranteeing an increased disability rating or percentage increase.
- Advertising expedited VA claims decisions.
- Requesting login credentials to access a veteran's personal information through secure VA websites like eBenefits or VA.gov.
- Using confusing tactics or ambiguous language to mislead claimants or coerce them into signing a contract.
- Telling veterans to forego VA exams and offering health consultations within their own network of doctors.

Cancellation requests must be received no later than 11:59 p.m. Central Time ten business days prior to the scheduled payment date. 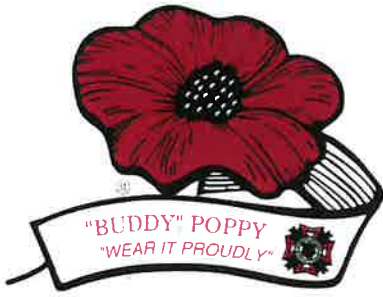

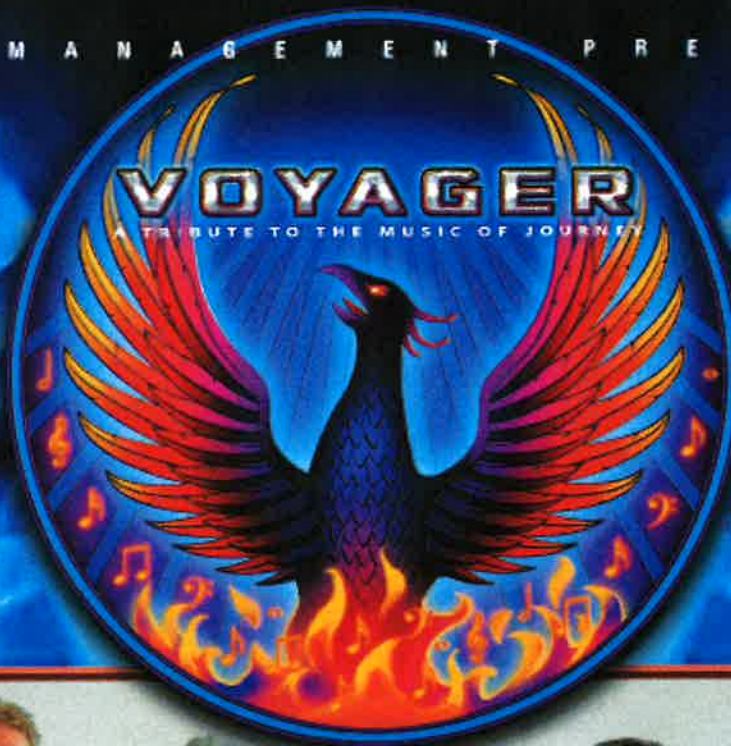
