

# DON'T FEED THE SHARKS

## What is a “Claim Shark”?

- A Claim Shark is an individual or company that charges hefty fees to “assist” or “consult” veterans with filing their VA benefit claims – this practice is illegal!
- Claim Sharks are not VA accredited, meaning they aren’t required to adhere to the well-established professional and ethical standards of VA accreditation, so their advice can often be misleading or even fraudulent.
- Like a “Loan Shark,” once you’re in, you can’t get out, and may be subject to new and hidden fees whenever you get a new rating, no matter who does the work.

## Some of their predatory practices are:

- Promising or guaranteeing an increased disability rating or percentage increase.
- Advertising expedited VA claims decisions.
- Requesting login credentials to access a veteran’s personal information through secure VA websites like eBenefits or VA.gov.
- Using confusing tactics or ambiguous language to mislead claimants or coerce them into signing a contract.
- Telling veterans to forego VA exams and offering health consultations within their own network of doctors.

## Veterans can protect themselves by:

- Always working with VA accredited representatives.
- Attending all exams ordered by VA.
- Not signing contracts.
- Not agreeing to fees or payments from future benefits.
- Not agreeing to pay for medical consultations or opinions.
- Not providing access to Protected Health Information or Personal Identifiable Information.

- VA accredited veterans service organization representatives, like the VFW
- VA accredited claims agents
- VA accredited attorneys
- Attorneys assisting with Camp LeJeune lawsuits who do not charge excessive fees

Why is it important to elect VFW Officers that understand the workings of the Post or District?

Key reasons for electing knowledgeable members are:

**Ensuring Legal Compliance:** Officers must ensure all Post business and clubroom activities comply with National Bylaws, Department rules, and public laws. Ignorance of these rules can lead to "illegal operations" and the revocation of the Post's charter or its right to use the VFW name.

**Fiduciary Responsibility:** Knowledgeable officers, particularly the Quartermaster, understand they are the sole custodians of all funds and property. They prevent common pitfalls like "deficit financing" and ensure all expenditures are properly authorized by the membership before payment.

**Conflict Resolution & Unity:** Familiarity with the National Manual of Procedure allows officers to handle "unusual situations" and "post squabbles" with authority. When leaders understand their specific roles and limitations, it prevents the "bitter arguments" and power struggles that can break a Post.

**Operational Continuity:** Experienced District officers provide a vital link between the Post and Department. They are responsible for instructing Post officers, assisting struggling units, and mediating disputes that local leadership cannot solve.

**Accountability through Audits:** Officers like the Trustees must understand how to conduct quarterly audits of the Quartermaster and Adjutant's records. This oversight is critical for maintaining transparency and member trust.

Please keep these items in mind when electing your officers, making sure you have knowledgeable comrades leading your Post and Districts, this will ensure smooth operations and success of your Post.

Arizona law concerning the use of smoking or consuming marijuana on VFW property.

The following is a summary of the law and its applications

In Arizona, while recreational (adult-use) and medical marijuana are legal, the use of marijuana in a Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) post is generally prohibited by state law and public health regulations.

Here is a breakdown of the legal and regulatory restrictions regarding marijuana use in VFW locations in Arizona:

- **Public Place Prohibition:** Arizona law (A.R.S. § 36-2853(C)) explicitly prohibits smoking or consuming marijuana in a public place or open space. VFW posts, as private clubs that are generally open to members and guests, are often considered places of public accommodation or at least "places of employment" where smoking of any kind is banned under the Smoke-free Arizona Act.
- **Tobacco-Free Facility Rules:** According to A.R.S. § 36-601.01(B), smoking is prohibited in all public places and places of employment. As VFWs are typically considered to be in this category, smoking marijuana (and vaping) is not permitted on the premises.
- **Private Property Exception Limitations:** While marijuana can be consumed on private property, it must not be in a manner that allows it to be smoked in public view, nor can it violate the clean air laws mentioned above.
- **Federal Funding/Rules:** Although VFWs are not strictly federal property, they are strongly affiliated with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). VA strictly prohibits the use or possession of marijuana on any VA grounds. If a VFW post is located on federal property or receives certain federal funding, federal law applies, which prohibits marijuana entirely.
- **Licensee Liability:** Liquor licensees (which many VFWs are) are prohibited by the Arizona Department of Liquor Licenses and Control from permitting illegal conduct on their premises, which includes the smoking of marijuana in public places.

**Summary:** You cannot lawfully smoke or vape marijuana inside a VFW post or on its immediate, publicly accessible premises in Arizona. Consumption must take place on private property.

The use of marijuana or its derivatives such as vaping, and edibles are Not allowed to be used on VFW property. Smoking marijuana on Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) post premises, even in a state with legalized medical marijuana, violates **federal law** (Controlled Substances Act). Because the VFW is a federally chartered organization, its bylaws and policies strictly adhere to federal law regarding controlled substances.

Specifically, this action violates:

- **VFW National By-Laws regarding illegal activities:** While specific clause numbers may change, VFW national by-laws and clubroom rules strictly prohibit the possession or consumption of any federally banned substance on VFW property. Marijuana is classified as a Schedule I controlled substance under federal law.
- **Clubroom/Canteen Operations Rules:** VFW Posts are mandated to follow federal, state, and local laws. Because cannabis remains illegal federally, allowing its consumption on post property violates the rules governing the operation of clubrooms and canteens, which can lead to suspension of these facilities.
- **VFW Post Charter Obligations:** As a federally chartered organization, VFW posts must maintain a lawful, safe environment, and permitting the use of a federally prohibited substance on post grounds jeopardizes the charter.

I hope this will set to rest the use of marijuana at VFW Post in the State of Arizona.

During recent District meetings I have been asked questions regarding several upcoming state property tax exempt bills. Presented here are the 4 bills and what they will or will not provide if passed. Stay active and involved.

### SB 1268 (Gowan)

- **Benefit created/expanded:** Full property tax exemption for the primary residence of a veteran with a **100% service-connected VA disability rating**.
- **Surviving spouse:** May continue the full exemption if the spouse keeps the property as a primary residence and does not remarry.
- **Structural notes:** Clarifies joint ownership treatment and exclusivity among exemption categories; applies beginning tax year 2026; emergency clause.

### HB 2792 (Carbone)

- **Benefit created/expanded:** Substantively the **same core benefit as SB 1268: full exemption** for the **primary residence** of a veteran with a **100% service-connected VA disability rating**.
- **Surviving spouse:** Continuation provision similar to SB 1268; also clarifies joint ownership treatment and exclusivity among categories; applies beginning tax year 2026; emergency clause.

### HB 2120 (Carter)

- **Benefit created/expanded:** **No new exemption amount** and no expansion of who qualifies by disability percentage.
- **Key change:** Expands “competent medical authority” to include the **U.S. Social Security Administration (SSA)** disability determination letter as acceptable proof for disability-based exemptions.
- **Practical effect:** Helps some claimants prove eligibility more easily, but it does not, by itself, increase the dollar value of the exemption.

### HB 2230 (Blackman)

- **Benefit created/expanded:** Creates a **new, disability-rating-based exemption for a veteran’s primary residence** that scales with the VA service-connected disability rating, including partial exemptions for lower ratings and full exemption at higher ratings (examples: 90%+ = 100% of property tax liability; 70–89% = 75%; 50–69% = 50%; 30–49% = 35%; 10–29% = 20%; <10% = 10%).
- **Phase-in:** The allowed exemption is phased in over four tax years (25% year one; 50% year two; 75% year three; full year four and thereafter).
- **Surviving spouse:** May continue the exemption at the level in effect at the veteran’s death if primary residence and no remarriage.

- **Administration:** Requires VA rating verification via the Arizona Department of Veterans' Services upon assessor request, allows electronic VA documentation, and expedites appeals.
- **Local government fiscal mitigation:** Creates a reimbursement mechanism for counties, school districts, and fire districts for foregone revenue tied to the new exemption.
- **Enforcement:** Enhances penalties for falsifying VA disability ratings to obtain the exemption.
- **Applicability:** Applies to tax years beginning after December 31, 2026.

## 2) Who benefits: the practical coverage question

### SB 1268 and HB 2792: high benefit, narrow population

These bills mainly help **one segment**:

- Veterans with **100% service-connected** VA disability ratings (and their qualifying surviving spouses).

If you are **below 100% service-connected**, these bills largely leave you in the preexisting capped/proportional exemption structure.

### HB 2120: procedural help, not a benefit expansion

HB 2120 can help disabled veterans who:

- Need an easier proof pathway using **SSA disability determinations**, especially if VA documentation is not available, delayed, or not applicable to their disability status.

But it does not create a new exemption or increase exemption value.

### HB 2230: broad coverage across disability ratings

HB 2230 benefits **veterans across the disability-rating spectrum** because it provides an exemption **even at lower service-connected ratings**, scaling upward as disability increases.

That means HB 2230 is the only bill in this set that is designed to help the disabled veteran who is **not** 100% service-connected.

## 3) Size and certainty of benefit

### SB 1268 / HB 2792

- **Benefit size (for eligible veterans):** Maximum. Full property tax exemption for the primary residence.
- **Certainty:** High, assuming VA 100% service-connected rating and primary residence criteria are met.
- **Tradeoff:** If you are not 100%, the bill does not materially change your tax outcome.

#### HB 2230

- **Benefit size:** Can be substantial for many veterans, including partial relief at lower ratings and full relief at high ratings.
- **Certainty:** Strong, because it is tied directly to VA disability ratings and includes verification structure.
- **Tradeoff:** The phase-in delays reaching the “full allowed” exemption amount until the fourth tax year of claiming.

#### HB 2120

- **Benefit size:** Indirect. It may increase successful access to existing exemptions by reducing proof friction.
- **Certainty:** Depends on assessor acceptance in practice, but the statutory authority is clear.

#### 4) Fiscal and political survivability (what tends to pass and stick)

- **SB 1268 / HB 2792:** These concentrate benefits on a smaller eligible group (100% service-connected), which often lowers aggregate fiscal impact. They also use existing statutory structure, which can reduce implementation complexity.
- **HB 2230:** This is a larger redesign with a reimbursement framework to reduce resistance from counties, school districts, and fire districts. The bill explicitly builds that backfill mechanism into statute, which strengthens its survivability in negotiations.
- **HB 2120:** Typically low controversy because it is a documentation pathway change rather than a revenue hit.

#### Determination: which is most beneficial to the “average disabled veteran”?

If “average disabled veteran” means the typical disabled veteran who is **service-connected but not necessarily 100%**, then **HB 2230 is the most beneficial overall**, because it delivers **graded property tax relief across a much wider range of disability ratings**, not just the 100% cohort.

#### Why HB 2230 wins for the “average” disabled veteran

1. **Broadest eligibility coverage:** It provides meaningful relief starting as low as 10% service-connected, scaling upward with disability rating.
2. **More dollars to more veterans:** SB 1268 and HB 2792 are “all or nothing” for the 100% cohort; HB 2230 spreads relief across the distribution.
3. **Local revenue backfill reduces opposition risk:** Reimbursement provisions are designed to prevent local government entities from treating the bill as an unfunded mandate.

### **When SB 1268 or HB 2792 is “most beneficial”**

If the “average” veteran in your definition is the average within the **100% service-connected subgroup**, then **SB 1268 or HB 2792** is likely “most beneficial” because they provide a **full exemption** for that group without the multi-year phase-in mechanics that HB 2230 uses.

### **Where HB 2120 fits**

HB 2120 is best framed as a **supporting bill** that reduces proof barriers, but it is not the bill that delivers the largest tax benefit.

### **Bottom line**

- **Most beneficial to the average disabled veteran (across all disability ratings): HB 2230** because it provides scaled, rating-based relief to many more veterans.
- **Most beneficial to the 100% service-connected veteran: SB 1268 or HB 2792** because they deliver full exemption targeted to that group.
- **Most helpful “process” bill: HB 2120** because it broadens acceptable disability proof via SSA determinations.
