Happy New Year, I hope the holidays were a time of happiness for you and your families and a time of reflection on all you have done and accomplished the year before. As we move forward into 2026 and all the excitement a New Year brings, it's a good time to remind comrades and auxiliary members of some standard protocol for dealing with issues that arise in your post and districts. I will concentrate in this article about issues on the VFW side of the house, but the concept is the same for auxiliaries: issues should be going through the officers at the lowest level first before escalating them to higher authority. As I hope you know I am always available to answer questions or to assist with questions concerning the Bylaws and rules of our organization. There is however a protocol for situations that arise where each post and district should have a Judge Advocate, that should be your first stop when dealing with an issue that arises. It is not only polite but it is protocol for Commanders at the Post and District level to be given the chance to solve issues at the lowest level possible before bringing them to the State Officers. It should be noted that issues involving criminal acts and or of violence should be brought to the attention of the State line once you have notified your state or district leadership so they are "in the loop" and can provide assistance to your officers when dealing with a serious issue, This is not to say that the State and its Commander do not care about issues a post or district is having but that they should be worked out by the elected officers of either the post or district if possible. If your issue is with a Post or District Commander, then you would seek out the next level to help resolve the issue. You can always call on me and ask for advice but the 1st question I will ask is have you spoken with your Post and or District commander or Judge Advocate in reference to your issue. Most issues can be solved at the local level with open dialogue and having a civilized discourse as well as applying the rules of our organization fairly and judiciously, Issues that need to go further up the line can be shown to have been worked on and unfortunately require more involvement from senior officers. Officers please remember you have a duty and obligation to research any issue brought to you sweeping the problem under the rug or dismissing them may cause a bigger issue later on and can put a post or individual in jeopardy As we enter 2026 let's make an effort to solve issues quickly, fairly and following the Bylaws and SOP's of our National, State, Post and Districts by giving the officers elected to these positions the opportunity to act, and allow all of us to focus on the true mission of the VFW.






Quartermaster's Corner

Arizona's minimum wage increased to \$15.15 per hour, effective January 1, 2026.

If you pay your bartenders, cleaning crews or any other worker an hourly wage you must comply with the minimum wage law.

Tipped employees can be paid \$12.15 but they **MUST make \$3 per hour in tips.**

What is a “Claim Shark”?

- A Claim Shark is an individual or company that charges hefty fees to “assist” or “consult” veterans with filing their VA benefit claims – this practice is illegal!
- Claim Sharks are not VA accredited, meaning they aren’t required to adhere to the well-established professional and ethical standards of VA accreditation, so their advice can often be misleading or even fraudulent.
- Like a “Loan Shark,” once you’re in, you can’t get out, and may be subject to new and hidden fees whenever you get a new rating, no matter who does the work.

Some of their predatory practices are:

- Promising or guaranteeing an increased disability rating or percentage increase.
- Advertising expedited VA claims decisions.
- Requesting login credentials to access a veteran’s personal information through secure VA websites like eBenefits or VA.gov.
- Using confusing tactics or ambiguous language to mislead claimants or coerce them into signing a contract.
- Telling veterans to forego VA exams and offering health consultations within their own network of doctors.

- Attending all exams ordered by VA.
- Not signing contracts.
- Not agreeing to fees or payments from future benefits.
- Not agreeing to pay for medical consultations or opinions.
- Not providing access to Protected Health Information or Personal Identifiable Information.

- VA accredited claims agents
- VA accredited attorneys
- Attorneys assisting with Camp LeJeune lawsuits who do not charge excessive fees

You understand such charges may be made within 2-3 business days of payment due date. For installment payments, charges will be made on or around the 1st or the 15th day of the month. This authorization will remain in full force until VFW has received notification from you of its termination or upon completion of the installment payments. Annual dues are subject to change. By completing this authorization, you acknowledge that you will only receive notice when the payment would differ by more than \$10.00 from the most recent payment. Contact VFW Member Services at 1.833.VFW.VETS (1.833.839.8387) or write VFW Member Services, 406 W. 34th St., Suite 316, Kansas City, MO 64111 to inquire about or cancel a payment, or to report problems such as bank closures, lost or stolen account numbers, closed accounts, or unauthorized transactions. Cancellation requests must be received no later than 11:59 p.m. Central Time ten business days prior to the scheduled payment date. If you are unaware of the charge date for your account, please contact VFW. If a payment is returned by your financial institution (e.g., due to insufficient funds, incorrect account information, closed account, etc.) the VFW will contact you at the address we have on file, explain why the payment could not be processed, and provide alternate payment options. The privilege of making payments under this agreement may be revoked by VFW if any item is not paid upon presentation. You may have additional rights and responsibilities under the Electronic Funds Transfer Act.

Life Membership Installment Plan Terms and Conditions: The VFW life membership installment plan allows any VFW member/applicant to purchase a life membership by making an initial payment of \$45.00 and (11) monthly payments. The member will be issued an annual membership card at the time of enrollment. A permanent life membership card will be issued upon the completion of payments. The life membership fee is determined from the schedule using the applicant's age on December 31 of the year in which the application is submitted. Delinquencies of 31-120 days can be corrected through make up payment(s) or plan end date pushed forward. Member will be dropped from the installment plan after 120 days delinquent and all monthly payments made to date will be applied to future years annual dues.

VFW POST MEMBER TRANSFER DECLARATION (used for transfers in accordance with Sec. 107 of the Manual of Procedure): I hereby certify by signature on this application that it is my desire to transfer my membership as indicated above. 

Note 1: Membership applications should be retained as a permanent record to aid in establishing length of membership, original eligibility, and other items of historical value.

Note 2: In some instances, it may be advisable to retain the minutes of Post meetings when those minutes contain policy decisions. Normally, however, those policy decisions would have been incorporated into the Post Bylaws, and the minutes would only be of minor historical significance.

Obviously, the foregoing list is not all-encompassing, nor is it intended to be. A good rule of thumb in determining what files and records to keep is that if the file or record has no financial or historical significance, then it is probably time to dispose of it.


