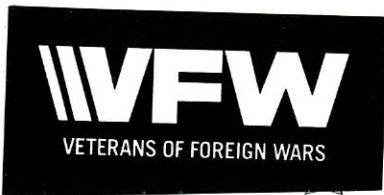

Dear Partners, Friends and Families of Arizona 4-H,

Our office has been busy completing the annual report and this experience offers us a chance to step back and reflect on the excellence in our 4-H program and the impact of our donors large and small.

Throughout 2021 we watched as some programs transitioned to more traditional 4-H experience and others expanded due to strategies we learned in 2020. Just as the program persevered, our supporters have as well and they emerged to ensure that Arizona 4-H is as strong as ever. As we enter the holiday season it is with great pleasure that we share our gratitude for all who stepped up to support Arizona 4-H.

2021 provided an excellent opportunity for all of our Great 8 Pathways to blossom. Our supporters helped make the following possible;

Agriculture – Copper State Judging Series, Ag at Home webinars and the first annual Arizona 4-H Stock Show and Expo is now planned for March 4-6, 2022.

Camp – James 4-H Camp is now prepared to welcome larger groups and a full-time staff presence with improved living quarters. We funded travel for 5 Arizona champions to the National SS competition in Grand Island, NE this fall. The Military Teen Adventure Camp (MTAC) brought together teens from military families to develop a sense of belonging and for skills development in shooting sports, blacksmithing, and more.

Community Service – The Arizona 4-H Summit returned to campus in 2021 with the first Summit Challenge with teams of youth exploring problems in their communities and ideating solutions to enact.

Cultural Understanding – An outbound youth was selected and host families were secured for inbound youth for the Japanese Labo program for 2022.

Civic Engagement – Held our first Engaged Citizens Event which featured 27 youth interacting with 10 Arizona legislators virtually in 2021.

Healthy Living – The foundation stepped in to support grant writing to help ensure continued teen health education at the county level.

STEM – Our STEM program welcomed the County STEM Ambassador Program with youth trained in cultural understanding to deliver relevant experiences for peers in their communities.

Leadership – After a year of virtual JOLT Camp, youth once again convened at camp to develop their leadership skills with the help of peer guides, our State Ambassadors.

None of the highlights above could be possible without the generous donations that make our work possible. So, to all of you we say THANK YOU!

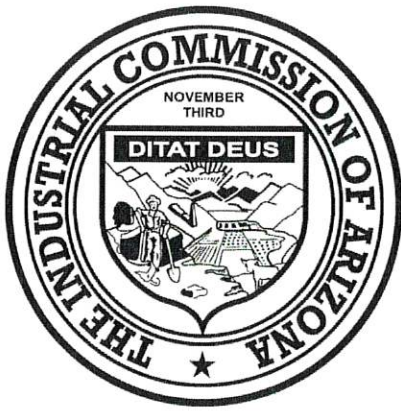

THE FAIR WAGES AND HEALTHY FAMILIES ACT

Effective January 1, 2022, Arizona's Minimum Wage Is:

\$12.80 per hour

EXEMPTIONS:

The Fair Wages and Healthy Families Act (the "Act") does not apply to any person who is employed by a parent or a sibling; any person who is employed performing babysitting services in the employer's home on a casual basis; any person employed by the State of Arizona or the United States government; or any person employed in a small business that grosses less than \$500,000 in annual revenue, if that small business is exempt from having to pay a minimum wage under section 206(a) of title 29 of the United States Code.

TIPS AND GRATUITIES:

For any employee who customarily and regularly receives tips or gratuities, an employer may pay tipped employees a maximum of \$3.00 per hour less than the minimum wage if the employer can establish by its records that for each week, when adding tips received to wages paid, the employee received not less than the minimum wage for all hours worked. Certain other conditions must be met.

RETALIATION & DISCRIMINATION PROHIBITED:

Employers are prohibited from discriminating against or subjecting any person to retaliation for: (1) asserting any claim or right under the Act; (2) assisting any person in doing so; or (3) informing any person of their rights under the Act.

ENFORCEMENT:

Any person or organization may file a complaint with the Industrial Commission's Labor Department alleging that an employer has violated the Act. Certain time limits apply. A civil action may also be filed as provided in the Act. Violations of the Act may result in penalties.

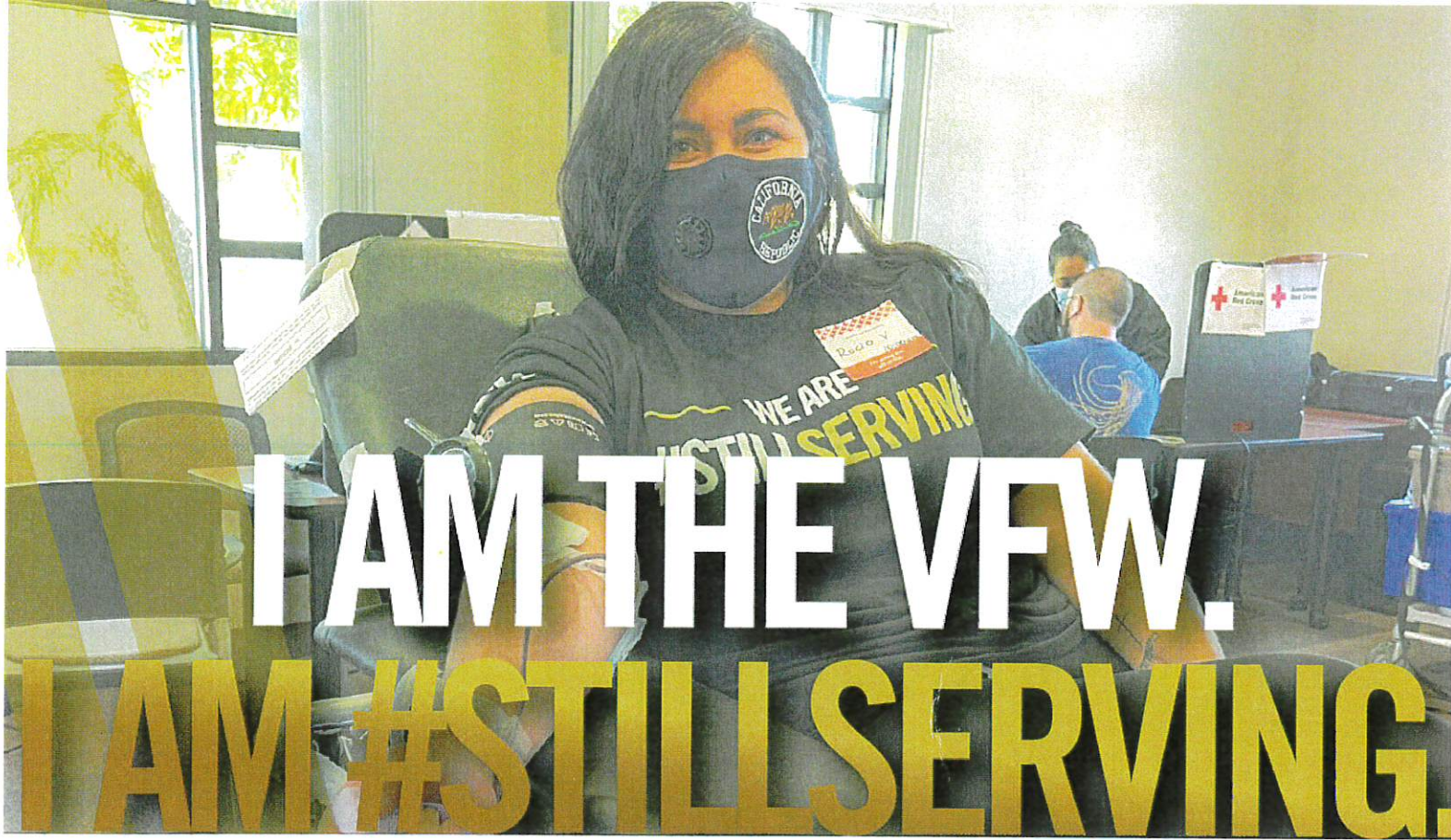

DOCUMENT INITIATIVES WITH PHOTOGRAPHS!

- **Select a Photographer**—Ask one person to handle photography. Give them a clear list on what you want.
- **Get in Close**—Focus in on faces and capture the emotion and excitement of the event.
- **Capture the Action**—A posed photo can work, but a candid shot when the action is happening will really capture what's going on.
- **Get Names**—Identify who is in your photos. This will be needed for captions and any media use.
- **Use Photo Releases**—It's important to have permission to use photographs of anyone. Be certain to get parental permission if there are kids present.

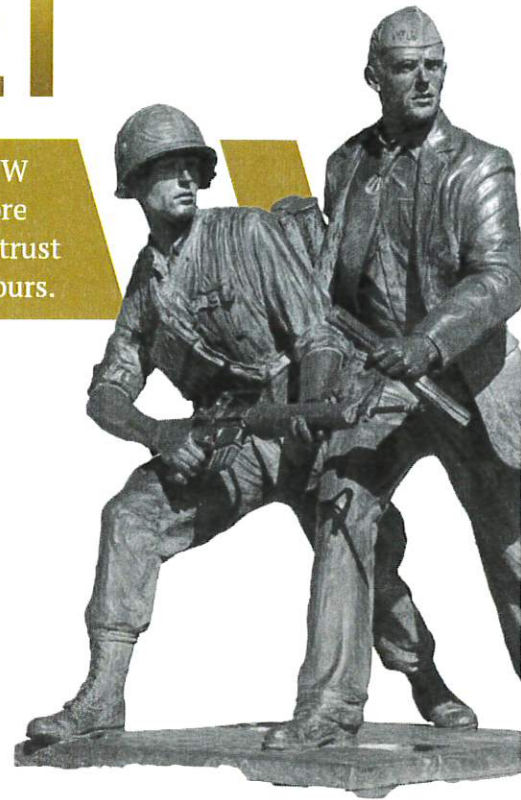

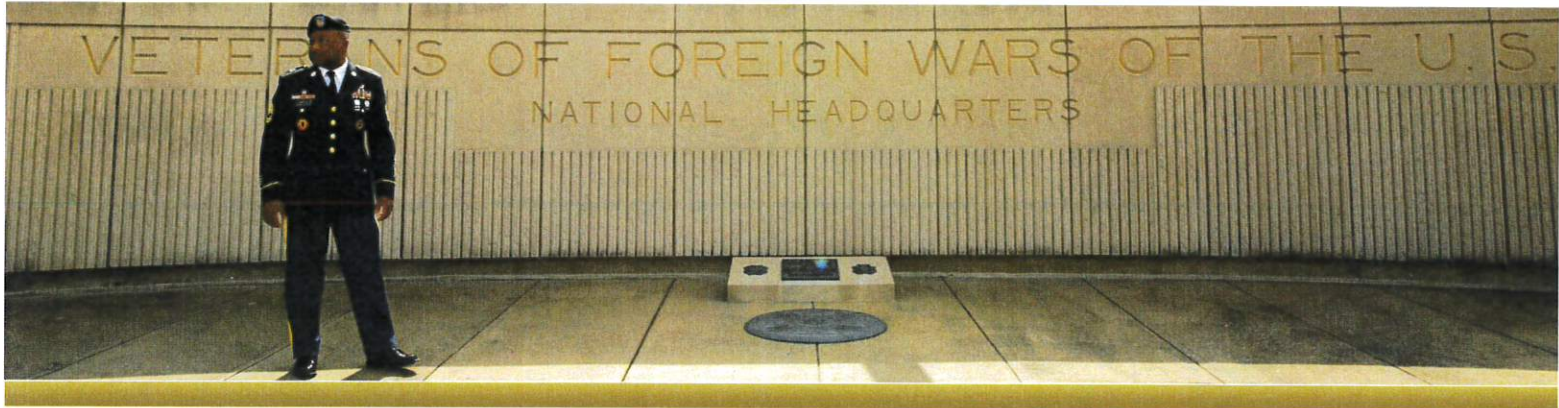

3. There is no time limit for requesting a **flag**.
