This month, it's time to use the TRICKS of recruiting and retention to earn the TREAT of a \$1000 stipend for your Post!

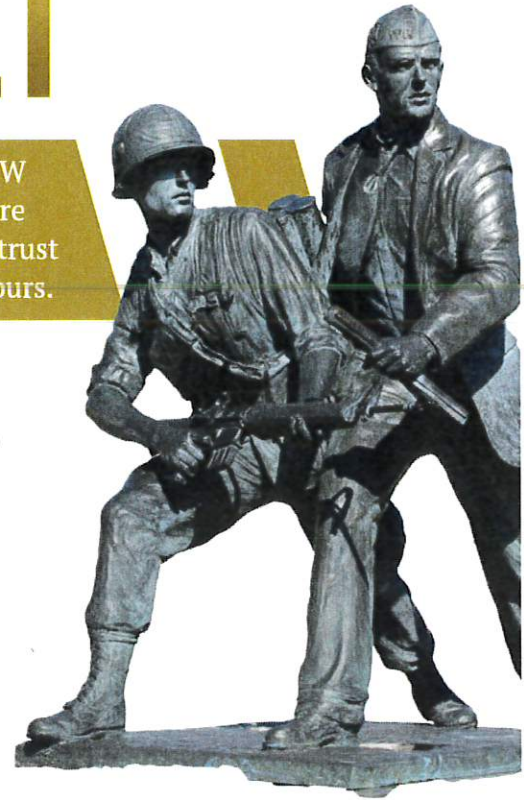

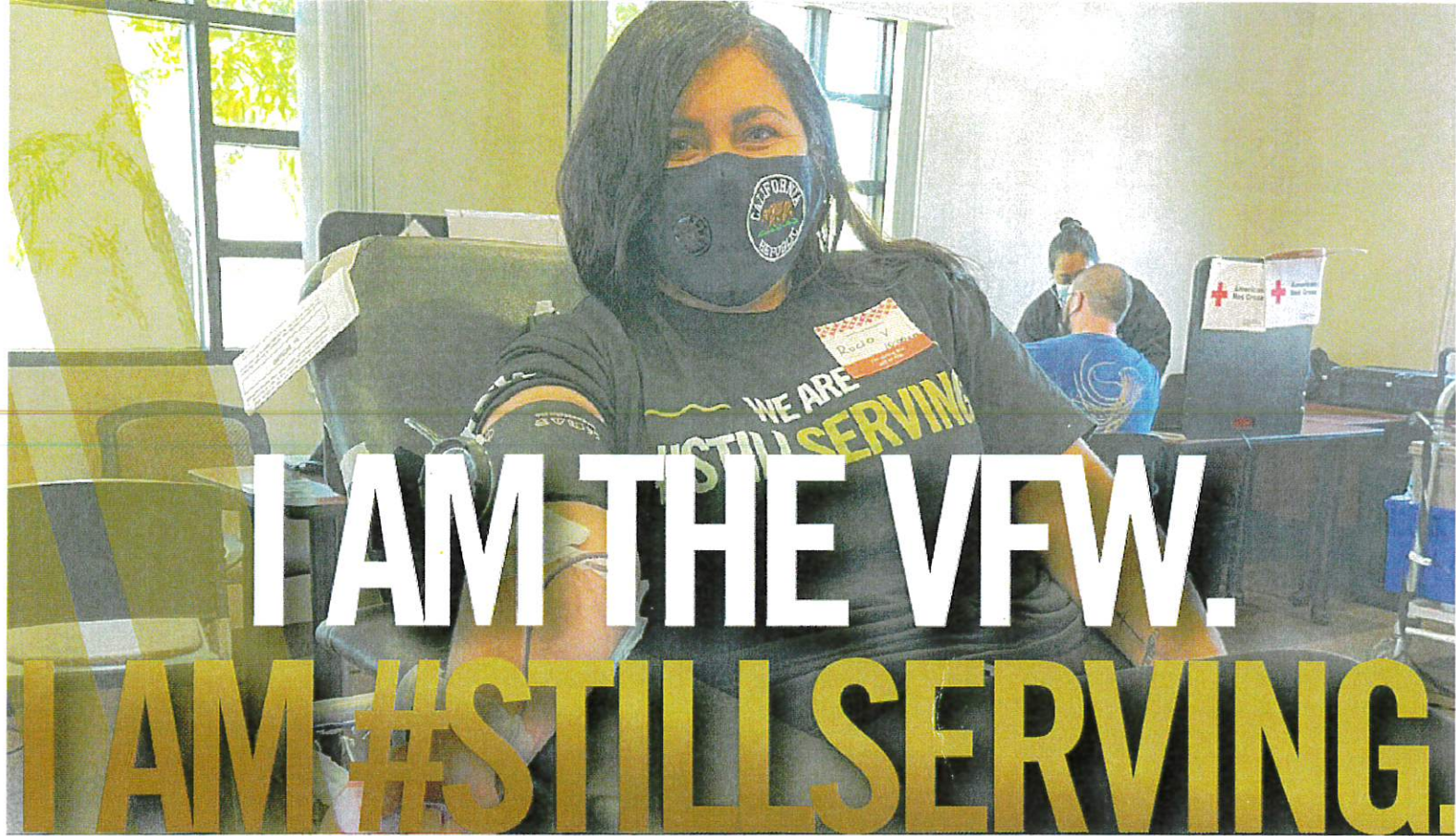

Are there groups in your community who need speakers or guests for their meetings? Sharing the work of your VFW Post and the veterans who are #StillServing would be great for civic clubs, local schools and other area professional groups.



Who, what, when, where & why

Be sure to include complete information in a press release or communication about an upcoming #StillServing event.



Tap a celebrity

Ask local news and radio personalities to join in sharing and celebrating our veterans' #StillServing efforts. Check if their organization can contribute airtime.

DOCUMENT INITIATIVES WITH PHOTOGRAPHS!

- **Select a Photographer**—Ask one person to handle photography. Give them a clear list on what you want.
- **Get in Close**—Focus in on faces and capture the emotion and excitement of the event.
- **Capture the Action**—A posed photo can work, but a candid shot when the action is happening will really capture what's going on.
- **Get Names**—Identify who is in your photos. This will be needed for captions and any media use.
- **Use Photo Releases**—It's important to have permission to use photographs of anyone. Be certain to get parental permission if there are kids present.

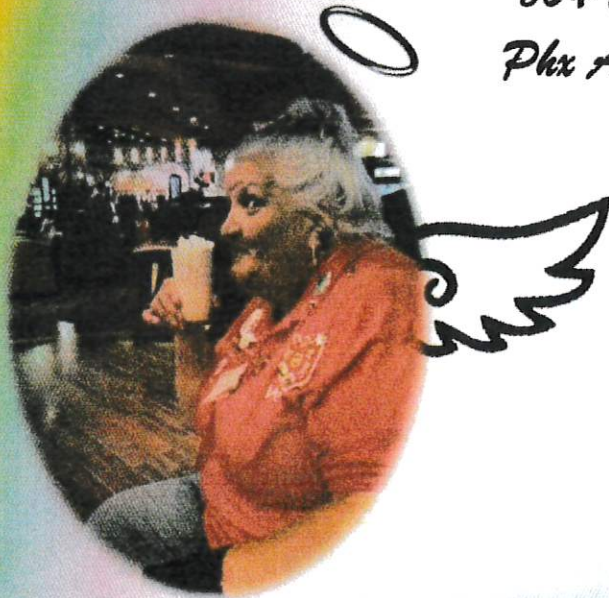

In late October of 2012, The United States of America Vietnam War 50th Commemoration established the Commemorative Partner Program, a hometown-centric, veteran-focused initiative designed for federal, state and local entities and communities, veterans' groups, civic groups, industries, businesses, museums, libraries, schools, educational institutions, associations and many other organizations to assist a grateful nation in thanking and honoring Vietnam veterans and their families where they live. The program is the primary vehicle by which the Commemoration achieves the five objectives given by Congress.

Three of the national objectives of the Commemoration are:

- (1) To thank and honor veterans of the Vietnam War, including personnel who were held as prisoners of war or listed as missing in action, for their service and sacrifice on behalf of the United States and to thank and honor the families of these veterans.

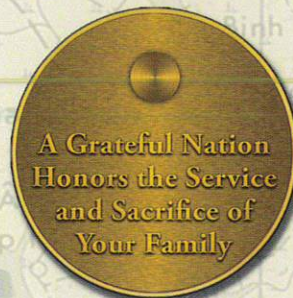

The **Deceased Vietnam Veteran's Surviving Spouse Lapel Pin** is for the surviving spouse at the time of death of a veteran who served on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces at any time during the period of November 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975, regardless of location of service. The lapel pin is usually presented with the corresponding DoD Certificate of Honor.

Symbolism:

- **Blue Star** - Symbolic of the Blue Star Family during the veteran's period of service.
- **Red Circle** - Represents the sacrifice of both the veteran and their family in service to our country.
- **Blue Circle** - The color blue matches the canton of the American flag and signifies vigilance, perseverance, and justice.
- **Laurel Wreath** - A time-honored symbol representing victory, integrity, and strength.
- **Message** - "A Grateful Nation Honors the Service and Sacrifice of Your Family" is embossed on the back, closest to the heart of the wearer and is our Nation's lasting message of thanks.

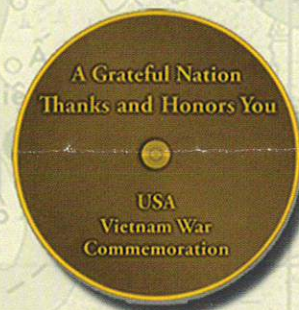

Symbolism:
