Attention of Post Commanders is directed to section1001 (25) of the Manual of Procedure concerning alcoholic beverages in the Post meeting room during the Post meeting: "The presence dispensation and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages or use of smoking/vaping products in VFW meeting rooms during VFW meetings is unacceptable and prohibited".
- 15. Attention of Post Commanders is directed to section 218(a)(11), Manual of Procedure, Trustees, which states that post trustees shall prepare and submit quarterly through their Post Commander, a Post Trustees' Report of Audit to the Department Quartermaster.
